Early Spring Leonardslee opens in April with magnificent Magnolias, prize-winning Camellias, and banks of daffodils.

Late Spring The flowering season rises to its peak in May, when the sumptuous blooms of Rhododendrons and Magnolias overhang paths lined with bluebells. The Rock garden becomes a mosaic of colours as the compact flowers of the Japanese Azaleas contrast against the forms of the palm and conifer trees. The famous 100 year old Rhododendron loderi are weighed down by a mass of fragrant blooms; then the heavily scented lakeside Azaleas are enhanced by their reflections in the water. There is a different vista to enjoy at every turn.

Summer In Summer the romantic nature of the valley takes on a magical touch with natural wildflowers, colourful Hydrangeas and superb flowering trees. Feed the wildfowl and watch the large carp basking close to the surface in the lakes. See the wallabies grazing around the gardens, look out for one of our white albinos and if you are lucky catch a glimpse of a little “joey” in its mother’s pouch!

Autumn The Maples compete with other trees for attention in their spectacular livery of russet, red and gold, as the colourful woodland fungi put on their own private show. From mid-September until late October the colours change every week, the end of the season can be as dramatic as the beginning! Take a minute to view the Alpine House with its variety of plants around the Koi carp pond. See the bananas shooting up in our temperate greenhouse.

“Beyond the Dolls House” The miniature model town and country estate in 1/12th scale has around 140’ of undercover display frontage and is one of the largest model exhibitions in the world.

Other Exhibitions We also have the Loder collection of Victorian motor cars and an enclosed sculpture garden with modern local work.

The Clock Tower The self-service licensed restaurant provides morning coffee and cakes, lunchtime hot and cold meals, home-made using local products when possible and afternoon teas.

Garden Notes Leonardslee has 9½ miles of paths, over 200 acres (80 Hectares) of woodland gardens, seven lakes with stunning reflections.

Accessibility Owing to the slopes of the valley, the gardens are not suitable for wheelchairs and we are unable to provide these for our visitors. There are many seats around the garden to rest on.

Location Located just minutes away from the end of the M23 between Handcross and Horsham, Leonardslee is easily accessible from London and the rest of the UK. *Travel times:* Gatwick 15mins, M25 J7 20mins; Brighton 35mins; Heathrow 60mins; Dartford 60mins; Central London 90mins.
